Background

Who is Texas Music Partners?

Texas Music Partners (TMP) is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit and a Creative Learning Initiative (CLI) Arts Provider whose mission is

To combine music, the arts, and the <u>STEAM</u> approach (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Math) to learning, to help students succeed in school and find a creative passion.

To plant the seed of creativity in a student's mind so they learn to think outside the box and stay creative. To use creativity to help them problem solve, through school and as an adult.

We do this by promoting music: on its own, through other arts, and through academics, while showing students how to think positively and learn from their challenges, in order to gain experience and succeed as they get older.

We do this at no cost to the institutions that use our services so we can reach more students. Our goal is to help students find a passion in music and the arts alongside technology and have it manifest into interesting careers, avocations, or hobbies related to music, the arts, or just the next generation of music lovers and patrons to make life richer and more rewarding.

What Do We Do?

Texas Music Partners accomplishes our mission in different ways:

Technology and Music – TMP offers courses to Central Texas Learning institutions to show kids how to do fun projects related to music using a smartphone/tablet. Smartphones/tablets are readily available, powerful tools that already exist in most households, thus eliminating the need to purchase other expensive high-tech equipment. Students can use their creativity and technical ability to create fun music-related projects and learn how these projects can turn into careers for future artists, engineers, software developers, videographers, photographers, producers, etc.



Live Music in the Schools - Another project of TMP is to teach students about different styles of music and bring in professional musicians to perform for them. Each year TMP will feature a certain style of music, artist, or theme. TMP will come to the school and offer a class on the season's featured theme, then a live band will come to perform a show, based on that theme, for the school. Getting the kids excited about live music and the history of music is a good start to getting kids to try and fall in love with band, orchestra, choir, or musical theater.

Thinking Outside the Box - These courses help middle school and high school students think positively while keeping creativity in their career decision and thought processes. This will better allow our students to compete with the rest of the world and cope with a rapidly changing job market.

When and Where Do We Do This?

Texas Music Partners offers these projects to public, private, charter schools and the occasional summer camp for kids from grades 3-12. TMP's busiest time is during the school year, when we come into the schools to teach these courses and to perform for the students.

Why Are We Doing This?

There are a number of reasons why these projects can help Central Texas communities and help get school kids more focused to stay in school:

- Helps students channel and "exercise" their creativity.
- Helps at-risk students by offering something that might interest them and work towards by staying in school.
- Keeps the creative process in mind, when choosing a career.
- Incorporating the <u>STEAM</u> approach (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts & Math),
 TMP helps students develop creative teamwork and problem-solving skills to help keep
 up with the rapidly changing challenges of the future job market, they will be walking
 into.
- Brings families and friends together with outings to see and record live music.
- Helps local businesses with these family outings.
- Helps promote local live music.
- Shows the student how to *pay it forward* by offering pictures, or a video back to musicians to help them promote their band.


Fiscal Year 2021 (Jul. 1, 2020-Jun. 30, 2021)

Texas Music Partners spent the summer of 2020 coming up with an online solution to the pandemic teaching problem. Unfortunately, the 2020-21 school year overwhelmed teachers. Because of this, many nonprofits, including ours, were left out of school activities because teachers were in survival mode and weren't bringing in outside programs. As a matter of fact,



most nonprofits that go into the schools to reach kids had a reduced demand or their school load suffered greatly.

Realizing that the 2020-21 school year wasn't going to be our best and our online solution was not going to be implemented, TMP took the time to build our committees, redesign our courses, write new courses, and get more financially stable for the next year. Coming into the next school year with a little more cash means we are better able to start the *Live Music in the Schools* program and get into more schools to reach more students. Thanks to our dedicated donors and supporters we are much better prepared to start the school year with a bang! We want to thank our donors and supporters for your help and continued support.



Around the beginning of the spring semester MINDPOP's Creative Learning Initiative reached out to its arts providers and schools to come up with a program where teachers could bring in arts providers or they could teach the courses that arts providers created. Since Texas Music Partners has been working with MINDPOP since 2017, we were one of a few chosen to help out by supplying two of our courses for this project.

- How to Take Powerful Photos of Musicians
- How to Make a Music Video

The <u>Creative Learning Initiative's</u> Spring "Cohort" session reached 28 AISD schools with over 14,000 students enrolled.

We continued by working with MINDPOP's Creative Learning Initiative on a summer program as well that reached around 1,500 middle school students.

This summer (2021), TMP is also working with Perez Elementary on its summer school program. TMP created a new course that the kids are loving called *How to Make a Digital Collage with a Tablet*. The course focuses on teaching students ways of making different types of collages, on their tablet, using music themes.



Looking Forward



The upcoming 2021-22 school year is planning to be in-person and Texas Music Partners is trying to rekindle relationships from 2 years ago and expand its <u>School Partnering</u> program. We are also hoping to get the <u>Live Music in the Schools</u> program off the ground so we can reach students by promoting music directly and getting them interested in taking band, orchestra, or choir for a true music experience, in the school.



Financial Report

FY2021's net receipts continue to rise slowly. We had a few more expenses but we also received our first grant. Even though we were ready to teach online, the school teachers were overwhelmed so we managed to save some money for when we go back to school for the 2021-22 school year and get our momentum back.



What your Donation Accomplishes

The average cost of a student attending one of TMP's courses: \$8.40
The average cost of a student attending a TMP performance: \$2.44

Think of how much you would pay to take a course, or attend a concert? If you donated just a fraction of that amount, monthly, you could impact many more students.
